

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR BRAMPTON PARISH

Minutes for the meeting held on 30th April at Wadshelf Village Hall

1. The meeting was attended by Bill Hoskin, David Catton and Andrew Wood representing the Parish Council, Andrew Towlerton, the advisor for the plan, three parishoners representing Cutthorpe, two representing Old Brampton and two representing Wadshelf/Wigley.
2. The Chairman, Bill Hoskin, opened the meeting at 7.30. and asked each person to introduce themselves.
3. Andrew Towlerton made notes on suggestions from everyone on what was deemed important to protect and enhance the character of the neighbourhood. These included:
 - I) Buildings
 - II) Amenity Areas
 - III) Green spaces
 - IV) Open spaces
 - V) Woodland
 - VI) Walls
 - VII) Primary Schools
 - VIII) Allotments
 - IX) Playgrounds
 - X) Reservoirs and streams
 - XI) Community facilities-old Brampton Church, halls in all three villages, the six public houses and the Cricket Club House at Cutthorpe.
 - XII) Flora and fauna-the Heathcote daffodils, ancient hay meadows, swifts, and waxwings.
4. The issues of transport and parking were discussed.
5. Andrew then led a discussion on development in the parish. It was felt that large developments would be inappropriate, but small infill may be possible to offer housing for young people who work in the parish. Any new building to be in keeping with the existing building materials. Andrew explained the difference between Green belt and Open Countryside.
6. The issue of high speed broadband was also raised, as the villages of Wadshelf and Wigley are poorly served.
7. It was suggested that those present give some thought to the production of a questionnaire before the next meeting. This would be circulated throughout the parish to gauge parishoners` views on the items identified at tonight`s meeting.
8. The date of the next meeting is MONDAY 18TH JUNE at 7.30. This meeting to be held in the Schoolroom in Old Brampton.
